- Minimum four (4) units. Preference will be given to project(s) with plans to increase units.
- Limit budget to 20% Support Services

1. Create Affordable Housing
2. Gain support from local Decision Makers
3. Increase Support Services funding

Initiate Housing First model	Rental Assistance	Give voice to homeless
Increase Temporary and Permanent Housing	Vocational and Educational Training	Educate community
Create housing for Chronically Homeless families	Credit Counseling	Work for more lenient ex-offender laws
Year Round Emergency Shelter	Get local government funding commitments	Decrease regulatory barriers
Follow Best Practice Models	Transportation	Get local government funding commitments
Address “doubled-up” living situations	Medical Respite	Raise awareness
Ensure housing with support services	Initiate youth programs	Create mentor program
