2009 POINT-IN-TIME COUNT

The 'Point-in-Time' count is part of a statewide effort to obtain an accurate snapshot of Virginia's homeless population in a 24-hour period. The Task Force on Homelessness conducted the annual count January 28 through January 29, 2009. Results revealed veterans and persons experiencing chronic homelessness, severe mental illness and domestic violence.

HOMELESS MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM (HMIS)

An important goal of the Homeless Management Information System is to inform both local and statewide public policy about the extent and nature of homelessness. This is accomplished through analysis and release of data that is grounded in the actual experiences of homeless persons and the services provided to assist them in shelters and by other providers. HMIS is administered by The Planning Council in conjunction with the commitment of the Continuum of Care. The Mayors and Chairs Commission on Homelessness also secured funding in their respective jurisdictions to support the HMIS efforts.
